Rider's degree programs are approved under the Veterans Readjustment Benefits Act of 1966, as amended. An application for VA Education and Training benefits is available online at [www.vets.gov](http://www.vets.gov) (<https://www.vets.gov/>) or [www.benefits.va.gov/gibill/](http://www.benefits.va.gov/gibill/) (<https://www.benefits.va.gov/gibill/>).

Veterans who receive Chapter 33 Post 9/11 G.I. Bill<sup>1</sup> benefits may be eligible for Rider's Yellow Ribbon Program (<https://www.rider.edu/admissions/military-friendly/benefits-programs/yellow-ribbon-program/>).

Students filing for benefits at Rider will be responsible for filing a copy of their separation papers (DD214) and/or their Certificate of Eligibility (COE) with the appropriate school certifying official.
